

About the City of Duvall

The **City of Duvall** (*pronounced DOO-vahl*) sits alongside the historic Snoqualmie Valley River nestled in the foothills of the Cascade Mountains

approximately 25 miles northeast of Seattle. Over 6,900 people live in Duvall, recognized as one of the fastest growing communities in the state. The City was named after James Duvall, a logger, who homesteaded in 1871. This small, yet diverse city is rich in history and tradition with residents representing many walks of life and cross sections of occupations and cultures.
